It seems that in every newsletter, I am compelled to ask for member support of our Capital Fundraiser and Endowment Fund fundraiser. The one stipulation of this donation is that our organization raises the same amount in donations, including monies that new and renewed memberships would contribute to this cause. Our membership email went out on November 18, 2022, to renew for 2023. Letters were sent to those without an email. It was sent to current members and those who have let their membership lapse. Better yet, please consider opting to renew as a lifetime member for a one-time donation of \$500. If you've been blessed and are in a position to make an additional donation, we'd be grateful. A donation in any amount to the Donauschwaben German American Center (DGACC) will help us reach our goal.

Many people ask, "what do I get for my membership dues?" The answer is twofold. Most simply, the DGACC board and our staff organize and hold free cultural events for the membership such as Kirchweih and Weihnachtsfeier, both of which offer various free refreshments. That alone is worth the cost of the membership and makes your dues a reasonable contribution to the organization. But more importantly, your collective dues contribute to the cost of keeping Lenau Park open. Where would our band or dancers practice without Lenau Park? Would our Frauengruppe or Seniorengruppe find another location to meet? Our German School would be forced to rent a rather large facility for their classes, and our soccer players would be playing on other fields. In the end, the real question is, would we even have an organization without our home at Lenau Park? We need everyone to contribute by purchasing a membership, donating

their time as volunteers, attending and supporting our events, and if possible, donating additional funds to help our organization to continue.

As always, we are also in need of volunteers. Our Wednesday crew has been busy, as always, improving the grounds and repairing what they can in an effort to keep Lenau Park beautiful. Many hands make light work and our Wednesday crew keep up with many of the things you may take for granted when coming to Lenau Park.
